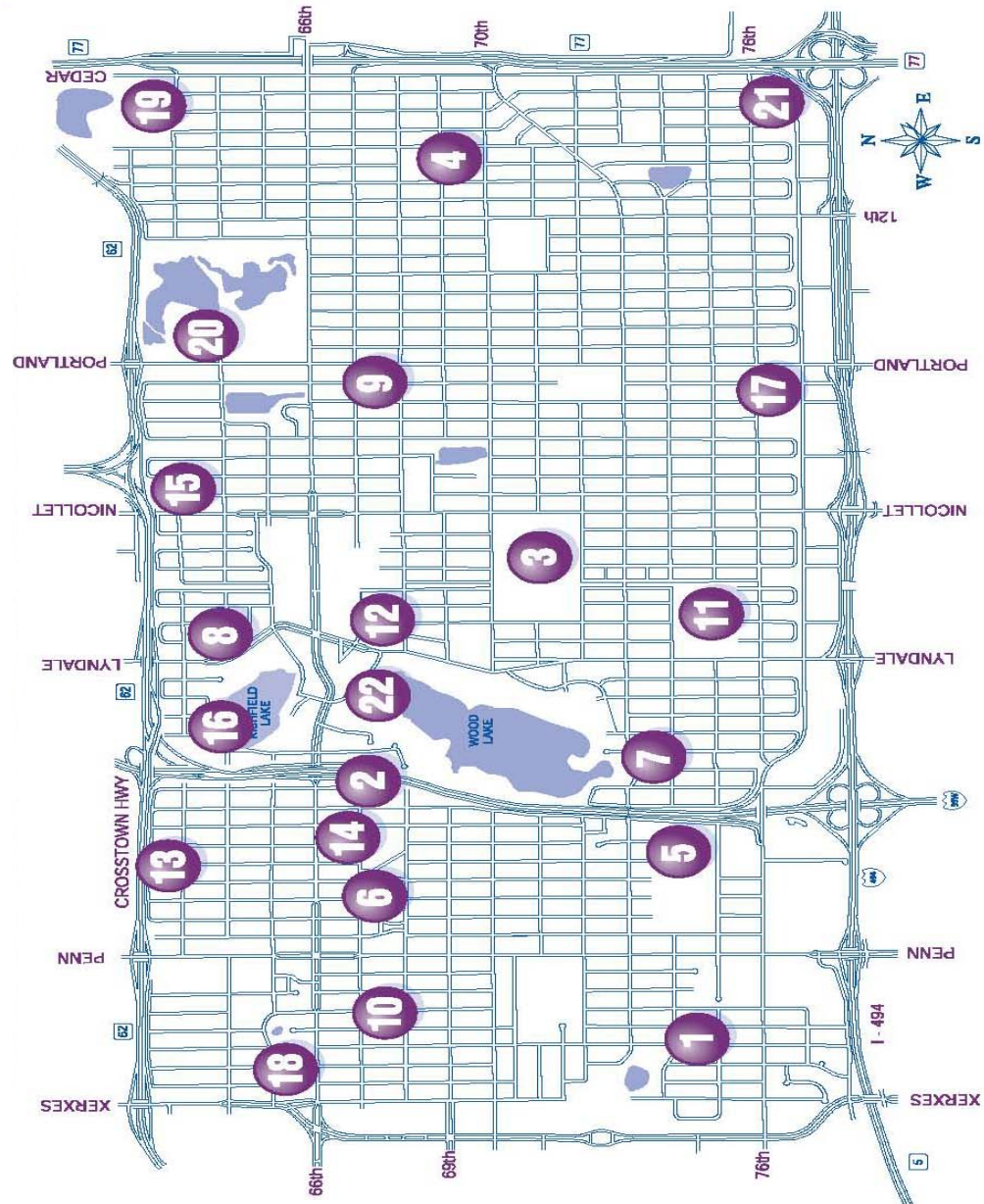

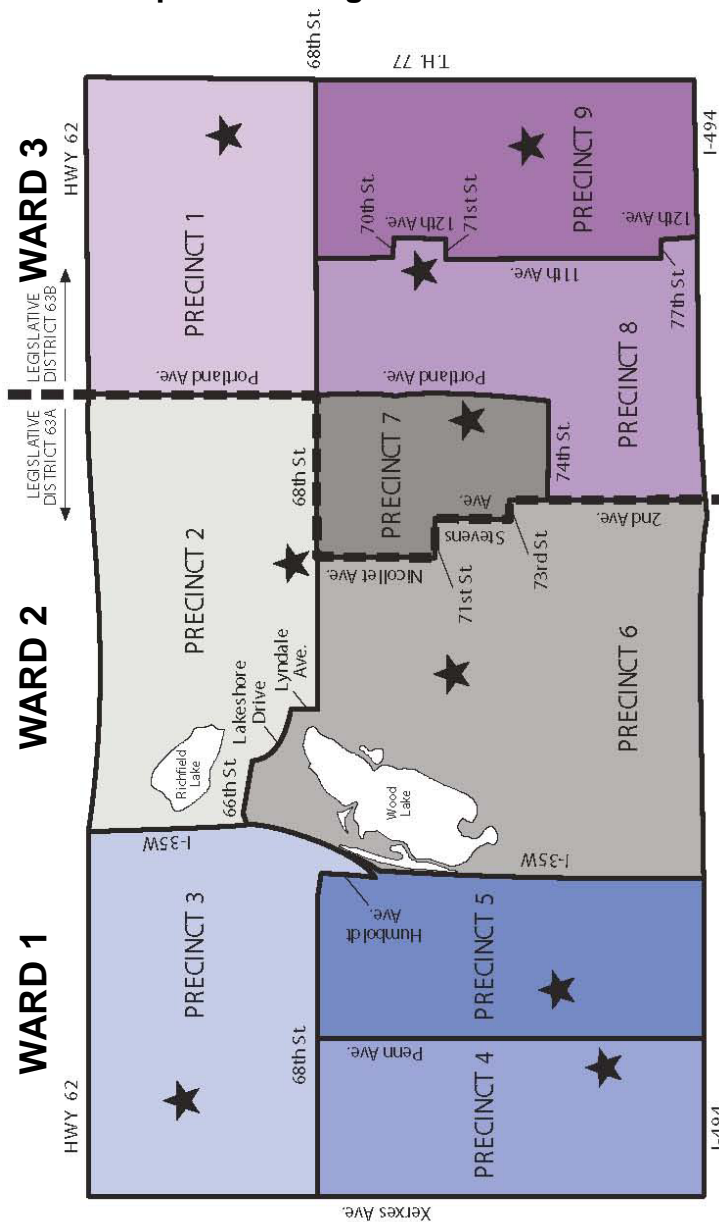

RICHFIELD City Codes ⁸

Common Code Violations:

Animal Licensing

All dogs and cats over six months of age must be licensed. Rabies vaccination proof is required.

Cars/Vehicles "For Sale"

Vehicles "For Sale" are prohibited from being displayed in any area other than an established residential driveway. They may not be parked or stored in any yard portion of the property. They may not be placed in the street or in any private parking lot.

Composting

Private composting is permitted if the following guidelines are met: only organic materials can be composted; composting must be enclosed; composting must be located in the rear yard, at least three feet from any property line; composting may not create a health hazard or a nuisance to adjoining properties.

Curfew

A minor may not loiter or idle in or upon the public streets, public places, vacant lots or other unsupervised places between the hours of 10 p.m. and 5 a.m. of the following day.

Firewood

Firewood may be stored outside if neatly stacked (elevated 10 to 12 inches above the ground).

Garbage Containers

All garbage cans or containers must be equipped with tight fitting covers. Garbage and recycling containers may be stored alongside or in back of a house or garage.

Garbage and Refuse

No person may accumulate or permit to accumulate any refuse on any property in the City which might constitute a nuisance by reason of appearance, odor, sanitation, littering of the property on which the refuse is accumulated or an adjacent property, or a fire hazard. City ordinance prohibits the outside storage of garbage and refuse on any property in the City. Examples of refuse: cans, paper, cardboard, bottles, wood (not firewood), appliances, furniture, tires, bricks, cement, etc.

House Numbers

All houses and commercial buildings must have house or building numbers on them large enough to be read from the street.

Junked or Inoperable Vehicles

Inoperable vehicles may not be stored on any property for longer than 96 hours.

City Codes ⁹

Noise Complaints

The noise ordinance prohibits loud noise from 10 p.m. to 7 a.m. M-F, and 10 p.m. to 8 a.m. on weekends.

Over Occupancy

The total number of persons occupying the dwelling or dwelling unit must not exceed the maximum requirements as indicated in the table below.

| Room Type | Room Area (sq. feet) | Max. # of Persons |
|--------------------------|-------------------------------|---------------------|
| Sleeping room | 70 or more but less than 120 | 1 per room |
| Sleeping room | 120 or more but less than 180 | 2 per room |
| Sleeping room | 180 or more | 3 per room |
| Multiple purpose room(s) | At least 1 room 120 or more | 2 per dwelling unit |

Exception: A child aged two years or younger is not considered a person or occupant for the purposes of calculating maximum occupancy under this code.

Parking in Yards

No person may park or place any motor vehicle in the yard area of any lot within the city.

Posting

The posting or affixing of any written symbols or markings or other paper or device, calculated to attract the attention of the public, to any lamppost, public utility pole or shade tree, or upon any public or private structure or building is prohibited unless permitted elsewhere in this code.

Recreation Fires

Permits are not required for recreational fires. Fires are permitted from 3 p.m. to 11 p.m. (612) 243-4511

Recreational Vehicles

May be parked either in the side or rear yard of a property as long as they are at least 3 feet from surrounding buildings, fences, etc. If the property is a corner lot, they may not be parked in the side yard of the property closest to the street. RV's may also be parked in an established driveway as long as the back of the vehicle is at least 12 feet from the curb. Must be operable.

Snow Removal

After a snowfall of two inches or more, no vehicle shall be parked on any City street until the street has been plowed curb to curb line. Call 861-9178 for 24-hour snow removal information.

Tall grass/weeds

Any grass or weeds over six inches in height is prohibited and must be cut.

Response Time

The Department handles around 3,800 calls per year with one of the top response times in the area at approximately 3 minutes. Fire losses remain low due to the Department's promptness and public awareness of good safety practices.
